She comments regularly on intellectual property issues in a variety of venues, including NPR, CBS, and Fox News' O'Reilly Factor, the Wall Street Journal, the Los Angeles Times, Rolling Stone, and Wired News. Prior to joining EFF, Ms. McSherry was a litigator at Bingham McCutchen, LLP, and wrote Who Owns Academic Work?: Battling for Control of Intellectual Property (Harvard University Press, 2001).
