Matthew Sag is an Associate Professor of Law at Loyola University Chicago School of Law. Professor Sag was a Visiting Assistant Professor at Northwestern University School of Law from 2004 to 2006 and a Visiting Assistant Professor at the University of Virginia School of Law in 2008.

Prior to his academic career, Matthew Sag practiced as an intellectual property lawyer in the United Kingdom with Arnold & Porter and in Silicon Valley, California with Skadden, Arps. Professor Sag earned his law degree with honors from the Australian National University and clerked for Justice Paul Finn of the Federal Court of Australia.

Professor Sag's research focuses on the law and economics of intellectual property. His recent work focuses on the interaction of law and technology and on empirical studies of IP litigation.
