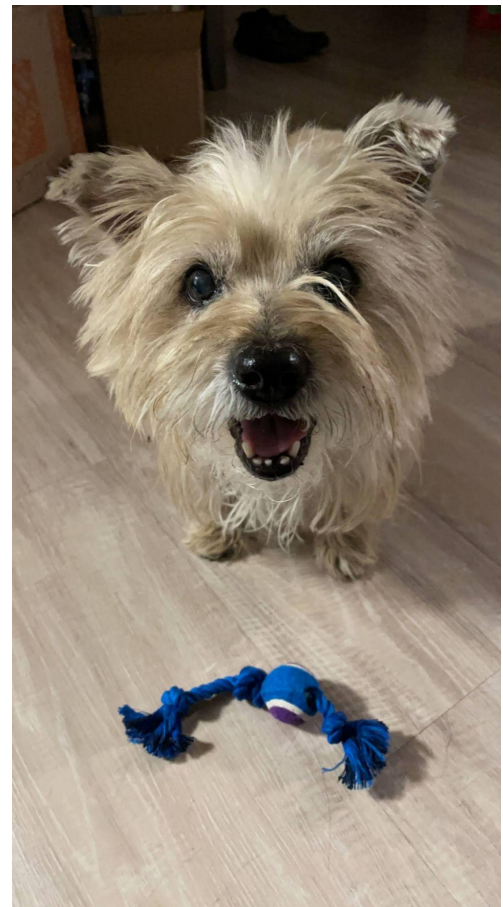

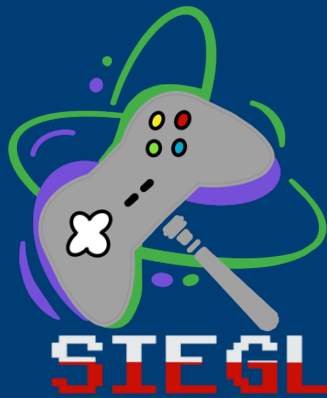

Christina Daniels-King is an attorney in the National Office of IRS Office of Chief Counsel. Christina works primarily on drafting international tax regulations and other published taxpayer guidance. Christina joined ACCI through the IRS Honors Program in 2019. Before joining Chief Counsel, she earned her LL.M. in Taxation (with Distinction) in 2019 from Georgetown University Law Center, J.D. (summa cum laude) in 2018 from Thurgood Marshall School of Law, and B.A. in 2015 from Baylor University.

Jackie Zumaeta is the Assistant Chief Counsel of the Tax Administration and Procedure Bureau at the Franchise Tax Board. Ms. Zumaeta earned her JD and LLM in Taxation at the University of San Diego School of Law, where she participated in the Tax Appeals Assistance Program and fell in love with tax. After finishing school, Ms. Zumaeta started her career at the Franchise Tax Board and was eventually selected to serve as the franchise and income tax liaison to the Chair of the Board of Equalization for two years. Ms. Zumaeta served as a manager at PwC before leaving to become the first Assistant Chief Counsel at the newly formed Office of Tax Appeals in December of 2017. In July 2019, Ms. Zumaeta returned to FTB in her current role.

Sophia Yan is an Attorney Advisor at the Tax Law Center at NYU Law, a nonprofit that seeks to improve the equity and integrity of the tax system through rigorous, high-impact legal work in the public interest. Her work at the Tax Law Center has focused on information reporting, the intersection of financial accounting and tax, and domestic corporate taxation. Previously, she was a tax associate at Skadden Arps in Washington, D.C. and worked for the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau. She holds a J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania and a B.A. in Public Policy, with honors, from the University of Chicago.

Darriane De Leon is a Judicial Law Clerk at the U.S. Tax Court. She graduated from American University Washington College of Law in 2020 and completed her LL.M. in Taxation at Georgetown University of Law in 2021. During law school, Darriane served as a Student Attorney in the Janet Spragens Federal Income Tax Clinic, handling tax controversy matters, and worked in several law firms. Darriane was born in Trinidad and Tobago and raised in New York City.

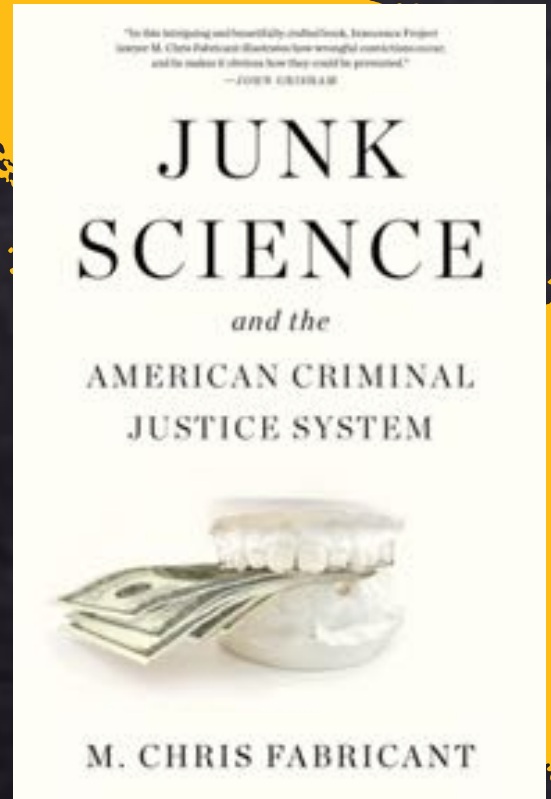

2022 - Cindy Avitia Immigration Justice Summer Fellowship Program

The La Raza Lawyers of Santa Clara County Charitable Foundation (Foundation) and the Katharine & George Alexander Community Law Center (Law Center) are pleased to announce the 2022 Cindy Avitia Immigration Justice Summer Fellowship. The recipient will receive a \$7,500 grant from the Foundation to work full-time for approximately 8-10 weeks at the Law Center.

The Foundation and the Law Center seek a Santa Clara University Law School first or second year continuing student who has a demonstrated commitment to:

- The legal equality of underserved communities as evidenced by community/extra-curricular activities advancing social, economic, and legal equality of Latinos, immigrants, or other communities of color; and
- Promoting diversity in the legal field, such as through membership in a relevant bar association or law school affinity group.

The goal of the 2022 Fellowship is to provide and expand legal assistance, education, and outreach for immigrant communities. The Fellow will be housed at the Law Center. The Fellow's duties will include development and dissemination of educational literature, legal research, community presentations and policy advocacy, development and coordination of a pro bono program to assist with immigration cases, and participation in outreach efforts that benefit immigrant communities. The Fellow will staff the weekly Consumer Debt Clinic housed at the Santa Clara County Superior Court, and develop outreach tools specifically for immigrants. The Fellow may work on immigration cases including but not limited to assistance and orientation regarding T-Visas, U-Visas, acquired citizenship, political asylum, deferred action for childhood arrivals, and various aspects of citizenship matters. The Fellow will work in collaboration with existing networks and community-based organizations serving immigrant populations.

Applicants must satisfy all of the following requirements:

- Applicants must have completed an introductory course through the Law Center or have equivalent experience working with immigrant communities.
- Applicants must demonstrate a financial need.
- Applicants must be available to attend Santa Clara County La Raza Lawyers Association Annual Scholarship Banquet, typically scheduled in Oct/Nov (date to be announced).

The application deadline is April 4, 2022; interviews conducted on a rolling basis.
