U.S. and International Headlines:

- <u>Ukraine</u>, <u>Russia Gear Up for War's Biggest Battles</u>: Officials expect large-scale tank and artillery battles; it 'will remind you of the Second World War,' Ukraine's foreign minister says
 - Related: <u>Live Updates: Ukrainians Flee Along Treacherous Route as Russia Eyes New Attack</u>: The U.S. military warned that Russian troops will most likely carry out a major offensive in the east. Austria's chancellor plans to meet President Putin in Moscow, making him the first European leader to do so since the war.
- Macron to Face Le Pen for President as French Gravitate Toward Extremes: President Emmanuel Macron and the hard-right leader Marine Le Pen will compete for a second time in a runoff on April 24.
- Gas Price Surge Fuels Fights at FedEx, Uber Over Who Will Pay: FedEx, Uber and Lyft have imposed new surcharges on customers, but drivers press them for more help
- <u>Before Giving Billions to Jared Kushner, Saudi Investment Fund Had Big Doubts</u>: Before committing \$2 billion to Mr. Kushner's fledgling firm, officials at a fund led by the Saudi crown prince questioned taking such a big risk.

- Other Barks & Bites for Friday, April 15: Australian Appeals Court Rejects DABUS AI Inventorship, Brent Lutes is Copyright Office's First Chief Economist, and Judge Albright Invalidates Reissue Claims Under Original Patent Doctrine: This week IP.
- Leahy/ Tillis Announce Bill to Balance PTAB Process: If we take the words of Senators Leahy and Tillis seriously, which there is every reason to do, it seems that they are contemplating allowing those defendants who are facing a lawsuit to have one opportunity to assert a meritorious challenge against the patent at the PTAB. That would be a big step in the right direction.
- Federal Circuit Vacates PTAB Ruling After Failure to Address Cost Reduction as Factor in Obviousness Finding: Given the developed record on the correlation between wire strength and material cost, we find that Everstar's cost reduction argument is a fair extension of its previously asserted arguments, and the Board abused its discretion in refusing to consider it.
- Vidal Takes the Helm as USPTO's Second Congressionally Approved Woman Director: On Wednesday, April 13, Kathi Vidal was officially sworn in and began her role as the new Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the USPTO. She is the second woman to be confirmed by the Senate to the position.
- DABUS Sent Back to Drawing Board Following Reversal of Inventorship Decision by Australia Court:
 The panel agreed with the proposition that a patent may only be granted to the inventor or somebody claiming though the inventor. The latter can only arise from a natural person, and not from a machine with no legal identity.









Consumer Law Update

Triple Digit Interest Rates and the Doctrine of Unconscionability

Though a recent California law capped the interest rate of small consumer loans at approximately 36%, the courts are currently being flooded by collection actions seeking to enforce older consumer loans bearing triple digit interest rates. **This webinar will focus on the landmark case of De La Torre v. CashCall**, a class action asserting that CashCall's loans bearing interest rates between 96%-135% were unconscionable. Hear class counsel describe their epic battle through the federal and state appeals courts, class certification, and ultimate victory at trial. KGACLC certified law student Vasti Montiel will discuss the Law Center's work battling collection actions attempting to enforce similar high interest loans.


