 - **[Report: ANDA Litigation is Declining](#)**: In total, the data show a decline in ANDA case filings of about 36% from 2017 to 2021. The same trend is noticed with the number of the patents involved in these cases.
 - **[Tenth Circuit Partially Affirms Decision Enforcing Lanham Act on Foreign Defendants Based on Extraterritorial Conduct](#)**: Citing *Steele*, the Tenth Circuit acknowledged that there is a general presumption against extraterritoriality, but that it may be applied abroad at least in some circumstances.
 - **[In Win For Google, CAFC Holds Patentees May Not Bend Claim Terms to Fit Their Needs](#)**: Where, as here, a patentee relies on language found in the preamble to successfully argue that its claims are directed to eligible subject matter, it cannot later assert that the preamble term has no patentable weight for purposes of showing infringement.
 - **[Federal Circuit Affirms 101 Invalidation of Secure Transaction System Patents in Victory for Apple and Visa](#)**: The courts held that the claims ‘simply recite conventional actions in a generic way and ‘do not purport to improve any underlying technology.
