

Donald J. Polden is Dean and Professor of Law at Santa Clara University. He is a graduate of The George Washington University and Indiana University School of Law-Indianapolis. Prior to joining the faculty at Santa Clara University, he served as Dean and Professor of Law at the University of Memphis for ten years. Over the more than 30 years in legal education, Dean Polden has taught courses in corporate law, antitrust and trade regulation, employment law, non-profit organization law, and others.
